
## Parts of a Tree

Trees have different parts that serve their own special functions. The primary root of the tree is the thickest. It holds the plant in the soil and takes in water and nutrients.. The secondary root branches from the primary root. It helps support the tree, and also takes in water and nutrients from the soil. A tree's leaves use light and energy from the sun to make sugar and carbon dioxide to feed the plant. Lastly, the stem or trunk keeps distance between the leaves and and the soil while carrying nutrients from the roots to the upper parts of the tree.
